Mr. Williams adds, The discovery of the original manuscript, now in the possession of Prince Louis-Lucien Bonaparte, shows the work to have been compiled in 1730, by Tonkin or Gwavas, and disingenuously published by Pryce as his own. As I placed on evidence, for the first time, in a letter published in The Cambrian Journal for 1861, the plagiarism of Pryce, and described the volume as...
